Occupation Description

Photograph persons, subjects, merchandise, or other commercial products. May develop negatives and produce finished prints. Include scientific photographers, aerial photographers, and photojournalists.

Nature of Work

Photographers produce and preserve images through technical expertise and creativity, while using appropriate professional equipment. They may enhance a subject's appearance with natural or artificial light, shoot the subject from an interesting angle, draw attention to a particular aspect of the subject by blurring the background, or use various lenses to produce desired levels of detail at various distances. Photographers also can create electronic portfolios of their work for display. Digital technology also allows the production of larger, more colorful, and more accurate prints or images for use in advertising, photographic art, and scientific research. Photographers who process their own digital images need to be proficient in the use of computers, high-quality printers, and editing software.

Distinguishing Characteristics of Levels

Basic

- Employees in this Role perform standard photography tasks.
- Employees take and process routine photographs of simple subject matter.

Recommended Education and Experience for Full Performance

High school diploma or GED and one (1) year directly related experience in photography, photo journalism, digital image editing, and/or graphic arts.

Minimum Qualifications

High School Diploma or GED and any directly related experience in photography, photo journalism, digital image editing, and/or graphic arts.

Operational

- Employees in this Role independently perform photographic techniques and procedures.
- Employees take and process photographs of subject matter determined by departmental needs and policy, utilizing all photographic media (still, motion, color, sepia, half tone, black-and white, etc.).

Recommended Education and Experience for Full Performance

High School Diploma or GED and one and a half (1.5) years directly related experience in photography, photo journalism, digital image editing, and/or graphic arts.

Minimum Qualifications

High School Diploma or GED and three (3) months directly related experience in photography, photo journalism, digital image editing, and/or graphic arts.

Advanced

- Employees in this Role perform highly skilled technical photographic tasks in a specialized field (i.e., medical, surgical, aerial, scientific, museum objects, artifacts, exhibitions, archeological sites, etc.).
- Employees prepare photographic layouts for public relations.
- Employees provide expert assistance to less experienced photographers.

Recommended Education and Experience for Full Performance

High School Diploma or GED and two (2) years directly related experience in photography, photo journalism, digital image editing, and/or graphic arts.

Minimum Qualifications

High School Diploma or GED and six (6) months directly related experience in photography, photo journalism, digital image editing, and/or graphic arts.

Knowledge

Customer and Personal Service — Knowledge of principles and processes for providing customer and personal services. This includes customer needs assessment, meeting quality standards for services, and evaluation of customer satisfaction.

Reading Comprehension — Understanding written sentences and paragraphs in work related documents.
