

# **CORRECTIONAL OFFICER SPECIALIST – PLUMBER**

### **General Summary**

Correctional Officer Specialists work within a specific operations and maintenance specialty, in addition to working as a Correctional Officer. This position provides assembly, installation, and repair of pipes, fittings, and fixtures of heating, water, and drainage systems.

#### Distinguishing Characteristics

This is the sole level of the Correctional Officer Specialist – Plumber position.

#### Recommended Education and Experience for Full Performance

High School Diploma or equivalency and three (3) years of relevant experience.

#### Minimum Qualifications

High School Diploma or equivalency and two (2) years of relevant experience.

### Essential Duties and Responsibilities\*

- Installs, repairs, and maintains various types of plumbing systems.
- Supervises inmates when required.
- Reviews blueprints, building codes, and specifications to determine work details and procedures.
- Prepares written work cost estimates and negotiates contracts.
- Studies building plans and inspects structures to assess material and equipment needs, to establish the sequence of pipe installations, and to plan installation around obstructions, such as electrical wiring.
- Keeps records of assignments and produces detailed work reports.
- Performs complex calculations and plans for special or very large jobs.
- Installs oxygen and medical gas in infirmary.

Bargaining Unit: Correctional Officer Specialist Plumber: Represented.

**Statutory Requirements:** Must possess and maintain a Journeyman's Plumber's License with New Mexico Construction Industries. This occupation is subject to regulation under NMAC 14.8.2 New Mexico Plumbing Code.

**Conditions of Employment:** This position is safety sensitive. Employment is subject to a pre-employment and random drug testing in accordance with all terms and conditions of federal and state rules and regulations regarding alcohol and/or drug testing. In addition, candidates must pass pre-employment Academy screening. Successful completion of the New Mexico Corrections Academy within one (1) year of hire is required. Must possess and maintain a valid New Mexico Driver's License. The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, must be at least 18 years old, have a least a high school education or its equivalent, be of good moral character, have not been convicted of a felony in the courts of this or any state or in the federal courts, and successfully pass any physical and aptitude examination the department may require. Employment is subject to a pre-employment background investigation and is conditional pending results.
