### Distinguishing Characteristics

This is the entry level of the Plumber classification series. Performs all plumbing duties under the direct supervision of a Journeyman Plumber who is journeyman certified in accordance with the Construction Industries Division Licensing Act, 60-13-1 through 60-13-59; 14.6.4.1 through 14.6.4.8 NMAC and 14.6.6.1 through 14.6.6.14 NMAC, as applicable.

### Recommended Education and Experience for Full Performance

High School diploma or Equivalent and one (1) year of plumbing experience in maintenance and repair of existing plumbing systems to include plumbing piping and fixtures in accordance with applicable currently adopted New Mexico Plumbing Code.

### Minimum Qualifications

Three (3) months of plumbing experience as it pertains to the essential duties and responsibilities of the classification.

### Essential Duties and Responsibilities\*\*

Participates in standard plumbing duties while receiving training in more complex areas of, maintenance and repair of existing plumbing systems.

### Distinguishing Characteristics

The Journeyman Plumber is differentiated from an Unregistered Apprentice Plumber by the level of independence, certification as per 14.6.4 NMAC and the ability to assist in more complicated plumbing projects.

### Recommended Education and Experience for Full Performance

High School diploma or Equivalent and two (2) years of experience maintaining and repairing existing plumbing systems, in addition to the minimum experience requirement for journeyman plumbing certificate to include plumbing piping and fixtures in accordance with the currently adopted New Mexico Plumbing Code. Journeyman certified in accordance with the Construction Industries Licensing Act, 60-13-1 although 60-13-59, 14.6.4.1 through 14.6.4.8 NMAC and 14.6.6.1 through 14.6.6.14 NMAC, as applicable.

# Minimum Qualifications

High School Diploma or equivalent and six (6) months of experience maintaining and repairing existing plumbing systems in addition to the minimum experience requirements for a journeyman plumbing certificate to include piping systems and fixtures in accordance with the currently adopted New Mexico Plumbing Code; Must be journeyman certified in accordance with the Construction Industries Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, Section 60-13-33, 36, 38 and 39 and NMSA 1978, Sections 60-13-9., A and K and 14.6.4 NMAC.

# Essential Duties and Responsibilities\*\*

- Repair and maintenance performed on existing plumbing system in commercial facilities, 14.5.2.19 (B) (1)
  (b) NMAC.
- This position performs work to maintain an established approved plumbing installation, which work is required to keep the installation operating in its approved function and configuration.
- Perform repair or maintenance on existing plumbing systems in commercial facilities; includes a like-forlike exchange of a portion or portions of an approved plumbing installation but does not include work that entails new construction, relocation, expansion or alteration of a plumbing installation.
- Maintains awareness of the dangers of the trade and perform all duties and assignments with the proper safety practices in use in order to reduce and/or eliminate the hazards common to the trade and also prevent the occurrence of safety problems.
- Has thorough knowledge of the legend of the campus, which will be provided by the direct line supervisor and is given instruction on locations of the various building plans, valve locations, code compliance, etc.
- Inventories his/her work chest to insure materials, tools, specialties, equipment, and supplies are available.
- Mentors Apprentice in all aspects of plumbing, reading blueprints, safety, water heaters, and plumbing fixtures, maintenance of irrigation system and back flow preventers as defined in 14.6.6 NMAC.
- Must have knowledge of operating the various types of equipment known to the discipline and mentors the Apprentice on safe operation also service this equipment to include all plumbing tools known to the discipline.
- Inspects plumbing installations for compliance with national and state codes and contract specifications.
- Prepare and maintain required log of Plumbing installations that are performed as directed by NMAC 14.5.2.19 (B)(1)(b).

# Distinguishing Characteristics

The Plumber Supervisor differs from the Journeyman Plumber in that this position devotes a substantial portion of time assigning and directly supervising work of at least two (2) full time employees,\*\*\* acting upon leave requests, conducting annual performance evaluations and recommending disciplinary actions. Interviewing and recommending selection of applicants and conducting training of personnel.

# Recommended Education and Experience for Full Performance

High School diploma or Equivalent and three (3) years of plumbing experience, maintaining and repairing existing plumbing systems, in addition to the minimum experience requirement for a journeyman plumbing certificate to include piping systems and fixtures in accordance with the currently adopted New Mexico Plumbing Code; two (2) years of which must be supervisory/foreman level experience, as it pertains to the essential duties and responsibilities of the classification. Must be certified in accordance with the Construction

Industries Licensing Act, 60-13-1 through 60-13-59; 14.6.4.1 through 16.6.4.8 NMAC and 14.6.6.1 through 14.6.6.14 NMAC, as applicable.

# Minimum Qualifications

High School diploma or Equivalent and eighteen (18) months of experience maintaining and repairing existing plumbing systems, in addition to the minimum experience requirement for journeyman plumbing certificate to include piping systems and fixtures, six (6) months of which must be supervisory as it pertains to the essential duties and responsibilities of the classification. Applicants must be journeyman certified in accordance with the Construction Industries Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, Section 60-13-33, 36, 38 and 39 and NMSA 1978, Sections 60-13-9., A, and K and 14.6.4 NMAC.

# Essential Duties and Responsibilities\*\*

- Devotes a substantial portion of time assigning and directly supervising work of at least two (2) permanent/full time employees. Acts upon leave requests, conducts annual performance evaluations and recommends disciplinary actions.
- Conducts training of personnel; may interview and recommend selection of applicants.
- Directs and participates in the maintenance and repair of the plumbing systems.
- Trains others in plumbing techniques.
- Develops procedures to improve maintenance and repair of plumbing systems in an agency or institution.
- Makes well-informed, effective, and timely decisions and perceives the impact and implications of those decisions.
- Identifies and analyzes problems; weights relevance and accuracy of information; generates and evaluates alternative solutions; makes recommendations.
- Makes cost estimates on piping systems and fixtures.
- Maintains stock inventory of regularly used tools, supplies, and equipment; prepare costs records and reports.
- Inspects plumbing installations for compliance with national and state codes and contract specifications.
- Prepare and maintain required log of Plumbing installations that are performed as directed by NMAC 14.5.2.19 (B)(1)(b)

**Statutory Requirements:** New Apprentice hires must be in compliance with NMAC 1978, Section 60-13-33 of the Construction Industries Licensing Act and be under the direct supervision of a journeyman plumber who holds a current journeyman certificate. Applicants for a Journeyman Plumber must hold a current journeyman certificate in accordance with NMSA 1978, Section 60-13-33, 36, 38 and 39 and NMSA 1978, Sections 60-13-9., A, and K and 14.6.4 NMAC.

# **Conditions of Employment:** N/A

**Working Conditions:** Work is performed in an office setting: late hours, weekends, on-call and callback work may be required. Will be exposed to regular periods of video display terminal and keyboard usage and stressful situations. Travel is required. Incumbent will work under stress and frequent time constraints.
