Licensure in New Mexico as a Registered Dietitian (RD) and valid current registration with Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR) as a Registered Dietitian (RD) or Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN).

Essential Duties and Responsibilities*

- Assesses and evaluates special nutritional needs of client/patients.
- Recommends or prescribes modified/therapeutic diets.
- May act as liaison between clinical dietitians and other clinical professional staff.
- Provides menu reviews for various providers and give feedback/technical assistance on federal nutritional requirements.
- Provides nutritional assessment of food products and recipes to include determining required portion servings and nutritional analysis for foods served to client/patients.
- May implement and monitor all state, federal, local and regulatory standards for dietary program.
- May work with Medicaid and insurance structures to assure children with special healthcare needs nutritional/dietetic needs are met.
- Develops, organizes, implements and evaluates nutrition education for client/patients.
- Educates client/patients, families, health professionals, educators, and other community providers on nutritional services for client/patients with special dietary needs.
- Prepares reports to evaluate and communicate on-going program activities.
- Generates and shares reports and nutrition care plans with medical providers, early intervention programs, school systems or other community agencies for children receiving on-going nutrition services.
- May provide leadership in the development of statewide plans for assuring access to quality nutritional services for client/patients with special dietary needs.
- May participate in IFSPs/IEPs/504s for children with special health care needs as appropriate and at parent, social worker, and/or nurse request.
